Week 1	<p><b>113. How many petitions are there in the Lord's Prayer?</b> Six.</p> <p><b>114. What is the first petition?</b> The first petition is "Hallowed be thy name."</p> <p><b>115. What does it mean to pray, "Hallowed be thy name"?</b> We are asking God to help us and others to respect and honor him.</p>	☆
Week 2	<p><b>116. What is the second petition?</b> The second petition is "Thy kingdom come."</p> <p><b>117. What does it mean to pray, "Thy kingdom come"?</b> We are asking God to bring more and more people to hear, believe and obey his gospel.</p> <p><b>118. What is the third petition?</b> The third petition is "Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven."</p> <p><b>119. What does it mean to pray, "Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven"?</b> We are asking God</p>	☆
Week 3	<p>to make us able and willing to serve him on earth just as he is served in heaven.</p> <p><b>120. What is the fourth petition?</b> The fourth petition is "Give us this day our daily bread."</p> <p><b>121. What does it mean to pray, "Give us this day our daily bread"?</b> We are asking God to provide us with all that we really need.</p>	☆
Week 4	<p><b>122. What is the fifth petition?</b> The fifth petition is "And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors."</p> <p><b>123. What does it mean to pray, "And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors"?</b> We are asking God to forgive our sins for Christ's sake, and to make us willing to forgive others.</p> <p><b>124. What is the sixth petition?</b> The sixth petition is "And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil."</p>	☆
Week 5	<p><b>125. What does it mean to pray, "And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil"?</b> We are asking God to keep us from being tempted and to make us strong enough to resist when we are tempted.</p> <p><b>126. How many sacraments are there?</b> Two.</p>	☆
Week 6	<p><b>127. What are they?</b> Baptism and the Lord's Supper.</p> <p><b>128. Who appointed these sacraments?</b> The Lord Jesus Christ.</p> <p><b>129. Why did Christ appoint these sacraments?</b> To distinguish his people from the world, and to comfort and strengthen them.</p> <p><b>130. What sign is used in baptism?</b> Washing with water.</p>	☆
Week 7	<p><b>131. What does this washing with water represent?</b> That we are united to Christ and cleansed from sin by his blood.</p> <p><b>132. Into whose name are we baptized?</b> Into the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.</p> <p><b>133. Who are to be baptized?</b> Believers and their children.</p> <p><b>134. Why are we baptized even as little infants?</b> Because God includes the children of believers in his covenant and marks them in baptism.</p>	☆
Week 8	<p><b>135. What did Jesus say about little children?</b> "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these."</p> <p><b>136. What does baptism call you to be?</b> A true follower of Christ.</p> <p><b>137. What sign is used in the Lord's Supper?</b> Eating bread and drinking wine to remember the suffering and death of Jesus.</p>	☆
Week 9	<p><b>138. What does the bread represent?</b> Christ's body sacrificed for our sins.</p> <p><b>139. What does the wine represent?</b> Christ's blood shed for our sins.</p> <p><b>140. Who may rightly partake of the Lord's Supper?</b> Those who repent of their sins, trust in Christ, live a godly life, and profess their faith before the Church.</p>	☆
Week 10	<p><b>141. Did Christ remain in the grave after his crucifixion?</b> No. He rose bodily from the grave on the third day after his death.</p> <p><b>142. Where is Christ now?</b> In heaven, ruling his kingdom and interceding for us.</p> <p><b>143. Will the Lord Jesus come again?</b> Yes! He will return to judge the world on the last day.</p>	☆
Week 11	<p><b>144. What happens to believers when they die?</b> Our bodies will return to the dust and our souls will go to be with the Lord forever.</p> <p><b>145. What happens to unbelievers when they die?</b> Their bodies will return to dust also, but their souls will go to hell.</p>	☆
Week 12	<p><b>146. What is hell?</b> Hell is an awful place, where unbelievers are separated from God to suffer for their sins.</p> <p><b>147. Will the bodies of all the dead be raised again?</b> Yes. At the last day some will be raised to everlasting life and others to everlasting death.</p> <p><b>148. What will God do to unbelievers at the last day?</b> He will judge them, and condemn them to everlasting punishment in the lake of fire with Satan and his angels.</p>	☆
Week 13	<p><b>149. What will God do for believers at the last day?</b> He will give them a home with him in the new heaven and the new earth.</p> <p><b>150. What will the new heaven and the new earth be like?</b> A glorious and happy place, where the saved will be with Jesus forever.</p>	☆
